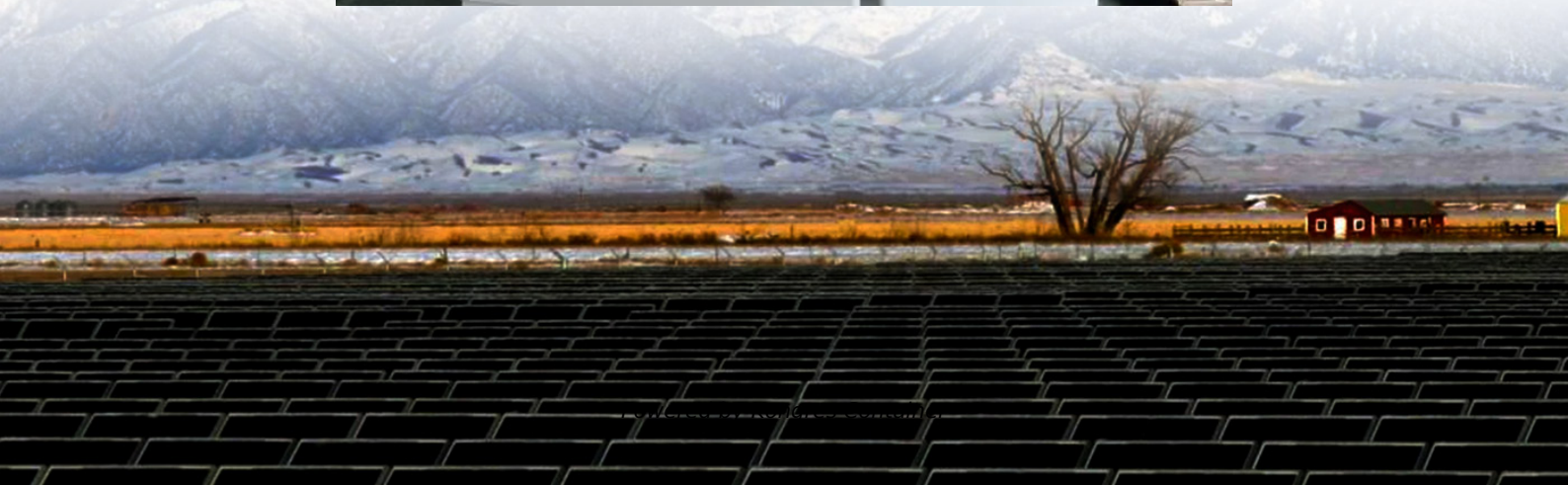

# Albania s household energy storage has not met with a warm reception



## Overview

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According to Eurostat data, 37.7% of Albanians were unable to sufficiently heat their homes in 2023, compared to a European Union average of just 10.6%. Albania's ranking at the top of this list starkly contrasts with neighboring countries, many of which fare significantly better.

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Despite a booming construction sector, Albania continues to lead Europe in the percentage of households unable to maintain adequate heating during the winter months. Albania has faced a deep energy crisis in 2024, a situation that has affected not only the energy production sector but also daily life for citizens and economic development. With a surge in energy demand, challenges in supply and rising prices have caused insecurity and concern across the country.

However, the country's energy mix has one of the highest shares of renewable energy in Europe. In 2020, the share of renewables reached 45% of the total primary energy supply, up from the 38% target that the government had set in its National Renewable Energy Action Plan (NREAP, 2018-2020). A year.

For 2019, regardless of income, 27% of households encountered issues with unpaid utility bills. 37% of all households' experience challenges in maintaining adequate warmth at home. 71% of single female-headed households encountered the most significant challenges in maintaining adequate warmth.
