Ethiopia Energy Storage Project Construction Status



Overview

Negotiations over the Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam have been formally halted since April 2021, when Egypt, Sudan, and Ethiopia failed to reach an agreement prior to the commencement of the da.

How much energy will Ethiopia have if the dam is built?

Upon completion, the dam's electricity generation capacity is expected to reach 5,150 megawatts, a significant boost to Ethiopia's energy sector. In terms of water storage, the dam presently holds 42 billion cubic meters of water, a figure projected to increase to 74 billion cubic meters when construction is complete.
