

# Latest solar module project in Morocco



## Overview

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Morocco could install up to 28.6 GW of distributed solar, producing 66.8 TWh of electricity and creating a \$31 billion market, according to new research that calls for rapid regulatory action to unlock this potential. ACWA Power has been awarded the contracts to develop and operate the Noor Midelt II & III solar projects in Morocco. The projects have a combined capacity of 800 megawatts in Morocco, according to local media reports. The two solar photovoltaic solar power projects each with a capacity of 400 MW.
