Liberia Base Station Communications



Overview

The Base Station which includes a telecommunication tower, a modern 7.3 meters satellite receiver and a 5kw solar module will power communication services that include voice and 4G mobile broadband data services to towns within eight miles radius of Gbargba-Gborketa and adjacent towns in Bokomu District. What is the telecommunications sector in Liberia?

The telecommunications sector in Liberia is active and competitive, with two main players: Lonestar Cell MTN and Orange Liberia. Both are global system for mobile communications (GSM) network operators that invest in network infrastructure and services.

What radio stations are in Liberia?

LUX 106.6 FM, University of Liberia. Radio Veritas FM and SW, religious-Catholic. RFI English FM, the English service of Radio France Internationale. UNMIL Radio FM, operated by the United Nations mission. Television stations: 4 private TV stations, none with national reach; satellite TV service available (2007).

Who provides air courier services in Liberia?

DHL, FedEx, and UPS provide air courier services in Liberia. The Liberia Telecommunication Authority (LTA) independently regulates and monitors the quality of telecommunication services while promoting fair competition. The LTA issues licenses to telecommunication and ISP companies. Licenses are valid for 12 months, renewable annually.

Does Liberia have a postal address system?

Liberia does not have a national postal address system or a unique address system where individuals can be easily traced or contacted. The Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications (MoPT) provides some postal services, including an expedited mail service (EMS) to the United States and other countries. It also develops ICT policy.

What is CSquared doing in Liberia?

CSquared signed a licensing agreement with the Liberia Telecommunications Authority in November 2021 to extend fiber infrastructure from Monrovia to Yekepa with planned links with Guinea and Cote d'Ivoire. More than 13 towns outside of Monrovia will have broadband internet access for the first time when the project is complete.

Does the CCL support high-speed internet in Liberia?

The CCL supports the supply of high-speed internet via fiber optic submarine cable to Liberia as part of the overall submarine cable system called ACE (Africa Coast to Europe) consortium.
