Overview

This is a list of United States military installations in Panama, all of which fall within the former . The U.S. military installations in Panama were turned over to local authorities by 1999.

What was the main naval base at the Panama Canal?

The main Naval Base at the Panama Canal was the Naval Station Coco Solo that had been in operation since 1918. From 1918 to 1993 Fort Amador in Balboa was the naval headquarters. From 1940 to 1941, the Fifteenth Naval District Headquarters building was in Bryan Hall.

Are there US military installations in Panama?

This is a list of United States military installations in Panama, all of which fall within the former Canal zone. The U.S. military installations in Panama were turned over to local authorities by 1999. In 1903, the Hay-Bunau-Varilla Treaty was signed between Panama and the United States.

What type of power does the Panama Canal station use?

Power for the station is taken from the Panama Canal transmission line. The current is 25 cycle A. C., three phase, supplied at 44,000 volts and stepped down in the substation through transformers to 440 volts.

Did the US Navy have a base in the Panama Canal Zone?

From 1917 to 1997 the United States Navy had a number of bases in the Panama Canal Zone. They were used during World War II to both protect the Panama Canal and the key shipping lanes around the Panama Canal Zone. [citation needed] Bases were built and operated on the Atlantic Ocean side and the Pacific Ocean side.

How did the US manage the Panama Canal Zone?

To manage the Canal Zone, the US founded the Panama Canal Company, a government-owned corporation that operated the Canal and other Canal Zone enterprises such as the Panama Railroad and the Port of Balboa. The Company

was run by a board of directors appointed by the President of the United States.

Where is the US based in Panama?

The authorized locations for the US presence in Panama will be: - The Teniente Octavio Rodríguez Air Base of the National Aeronaval Service located in Panama Pacific; - The Vasco Núñez de Balboa naval base; - The naval base Captain of Frigate DEM. Noel A. Rodríguez; - The Cristóbal Colón Naval Air Base.
