The battery cabinet does not respond after opening



Overview

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One of the most common troubleshooting calls we receive is: "My safe won't open. What do I do?"

" Here are five common reasons why your safe won't open, and what steps you should try before you call a technician. Fingers crossed, the reason your safe won't open is as simple as dead batteries. Before.

If your safe is not opening, it may be caused by: Make sure you are entering the correct combination. □ Two beeps or a green light = correct code. □ Single beep or three beeps = incorrect code. Check the expiration date on the battery. Use Duracell or Energizer 9V alkaline batteries with at least 5.

It is highly recommended to use a battery with a minimum five-year expiration date. Most likely, your lock will not operate properly if a battery other than this is used. What should I do if my electronic lock drains my battery quickly?

If the correct battery is installed (9-volt ALKALINE).
