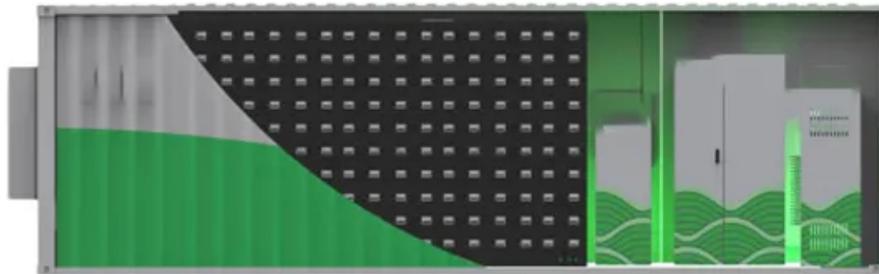

When did Botswana start broadcasting?

Botswana Television (BTV), the country's first national television station and a government-owned broadcaster, began broadcasting in July 2000. It initially offered three hours of programming on weekdays and five on weekends in Setswana and English, featuring news, entertainment, and sports, with plans to produce 60% of its programming locally.

How many service stations are there in Botswana?
